



Palmera Scarf

This reversible scarf is inspired by the swaying palms that grace our urban streets and fringe our lovely coastline. The main section of the scarf is crocheted "long ways" in a variegated yarn, while strips of solid color run its length between lacey edgings.

Materials used

YARN A: 3 skeins Trendsetter Recycled Linen Hand Paint (84% recycled linen, 16% linen; 150 yds). Sample used 2 full skeins and part of the third skein. Sample color: #13, Ravine.

YARN B: 2 balls Lana Grossa Solo Lino (80% recycled linen (viscose), 20% linen; approx. 132 yds.). Sample used 2 balls: 1 ball for the lengthwise strips, 1 ball for lace edgings. Sample color: #019, celery.

Changing the scarf's size may change yardage requirements.

Crochet hook: US #G (4.0 mm). Or size to obtain gauge.

Darning needle for weaving in ends.

Optional: removable stitch markers (for holding live loops or assist in counting)

Gauge 6 sc per inch, after blocking.

Finished size: approximately 7" x 58".

Stitches used and abbreviations

ch.	chain
ch-#	chain-1, or other number
dc	double crochet
hdc	half double crochet
rep.	repeat
sc	single crochet
st./sts.	stitch/stitches
tr	treble crochet

Tip: Go under both loops when making a stitch, except during the first row of main section.

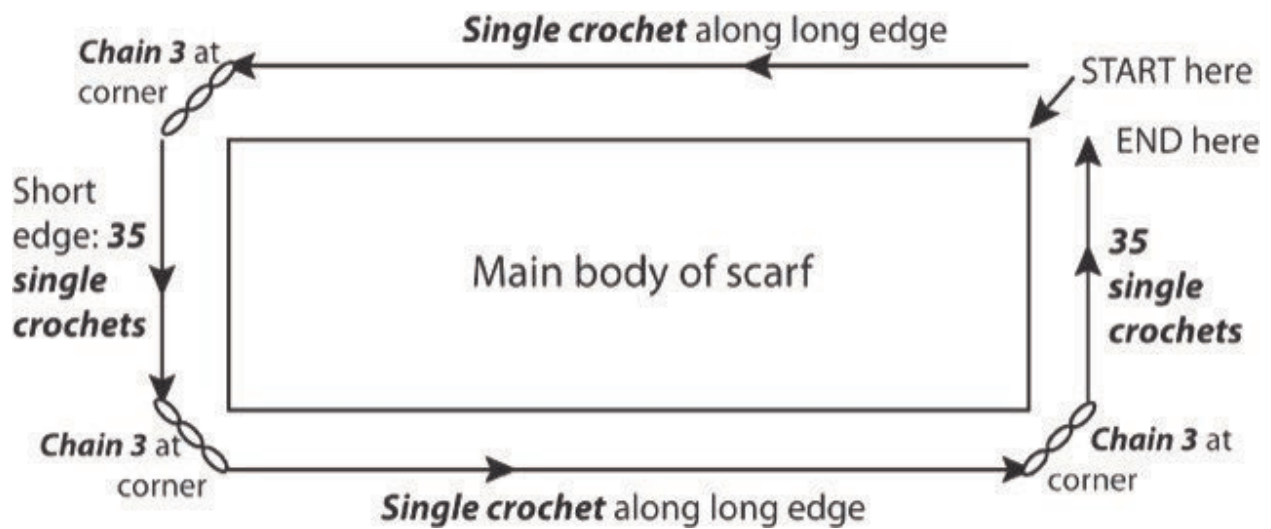
Main section of scarf

Using YARN A, make a slip knot and ch. 258 (this pattern is a repeat of 16 sts. + 2, if you want to change the length of this scarf).

- Row 1. Make 1 sc in 2nd ch. from hook, * sc in next ch., ch. 1, skip next ch., 1 hdc in next ch., ch. 1, skip next ch., 1 dc in next ch., (ch. 1, skip next ch., tr in next ch.) twice, ch. 1, skip next ch., 1 dc in next ch., ch. 1, skip next ch., 1 hdc in next ch., ch. 1, skip next ch., 1 sc in next ch. **, ch. 1, skip next ch. Rep. from * across the length, ending the last repeat at **, then 1 sc in final ch.; turn.
- Row 2. ch. 1, place 1 sc in each st. and ch-1 space across; turn.
- Row 3. ch. 1, place 1 sc in each st. across; turn.
- Row 4. ch. 4 (counts as a tr), skip 1st sc, * 1 tr in next sc, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 dc in next sc, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 hdc in next sc, (ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 sc in next st.) twice, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 hdc in next sc, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 dc in next sc, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 tr in next st. **, ch. 1, skip next sc. Rep. from * across the length, ending last rep. at **, 1 tr in final sc; turn.
- Row 5. ch. 4 (counts as a tr), skip 1st tr, * tr in next tr, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 dc in next dc, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 hdc in next hdc, (ch. 1, sc) in each of the next 2 sc, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 hdc in next hdc, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 dc in next dc, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 tr in next tr **, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space. Rep. from * across, ending last rep. at **, tr in the top of the 4th ch. of turning ch.; turn.
- Row 6. Repeat row 2, putting 1 sc in top of turning ch. at end of row. At end of row 6, cut YARN A and attach YARN B. Turn.
- Row 7. Using YARN B, repeat row 3.
- Row 8. ch. 1, 1 sc in 1st sc, 1 sc in 2nd sc, * ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 hdc in next sc, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 dc in next sc, (ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 tr in next sc) twice, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 dc in next sc, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 hdc in next sc, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 sc in next sc **, ch. 1, skip next sc, 1 sc in next sc. Rep. from * across, ending last repeat at **, 1 sc in final sc; turn.
- Row 9. ch. 1, 1 sc in 1st sc, 1 sc in 2nd sc, * ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 hdc in next hdc, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 dc in next dc, (ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 tr in next tr) twice, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 dc in next dc, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 hdc in next hdc, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 sc in next sc **, ch. 1, skip next ch-1 space, 1 sc in next sc. Rep. from * across, ending last repeat at **, 1 sc in final sc; turn.
- Row 10. Repeat row 2. At end of row, cut YARN B and attach YARN A. Turn.
- Row 11. Using YARN A, repeat row 3.
- Row 12-13. Repeat rows 4 - 5.
- Row 14. Repeat row 2, putting 1 sc in top of turning ch. at end of row. Turn.
- Row 15. Repeat row 3.
- Row 16-17. Repeat rows 8 - 9.
- Row 18. Repeat row 2. At end of row 18, cut YARN A, and attach YARN B. Turn.
- Row 19. Using YARN B, repeat row 3.
- Row 20-21. Repeat rows 4 - 5.
- Row 22. Repeat row 2, putting 1 sc in top of turning ch. at end of row. At end of row 22, cut YARN B and attach YARN A. Turn.
- Row 23. Using YARN A, repeat row 3.
- Row 24-25. Repeat rows 8 - 9.
- Row 26-27. Repeat rows 2 - 3.
- Row 28. Repeat row 4. Do not turn (yet).

Edge all four sides of scarf

Using YARN A, ch. 1, turn. Place 1 sc in each st. on long side of scarf. At 1st corner, ch. 3; then place 35 sc along the short side of scarf, stitching along the sides of your stitches. At 2nd corner, ch. 3, then place 1 sc in each st. on the other long side. At 3rd corner, ch. 3; then place 35 sc along the final short side of scarf. At the end of the 4th (short) side, ch. 3 and join with a slip st. to the beginning of the (1st) long side. Cut YARN A and pull the end through the loop.



The lace edgings

You will be crocheting back and forth across the short sides of scarf to form lace edgings.

- Set-up row 1. Using YARN B, make a slip knot, place 1 sc in 1st sc along a short side, 1 sc in next sc, *ch. 7, skip 2 sc, 1 sc in each of next 3 sc. Rep. from * five more times, then ch. 7, skip 2 sc, 1 sc in last sc, then 1 sc in top of ch-3 space in corner. Turn.
- Set-up row 2. ch. 1, 1 sc in 1st sc, skip next sc, * (5 sc, ch. 7, 5 sc) in next ch-7 space, ch. 1. Rep. from * across, ending with (5 sc, ch. 7, 5 sc) in last ch-7 space, skip the second-to-last sc, 1 tr in last sc. Turn.
- Set-up row 3. ch. 4 (counts as a tr), * (5 sc, ch. 7, 5 sc) in next ch-7 space, ch. 1. Rep. from * across, ending with (5 sc, ch. 7, 5 sc) in the last ch-7 space, 1 tr in last sc. Turn.
- Row 1. ch. 4 (counts as a tr), * (5 sc, ch. 7, 5 sc) in next ch-7 space, ch. 1. Rep. from * across, ending with (5 sc, ch. 7, 5 sc) in final ch-7 space, 1 tr in top of ch-4 turning ch. Turn.
- Rows 2-6. Rep. row 1.
- Row 7. ch. 4 (counts as a tr), * (5 sc, ch. 3, 5 sc) in next ch-7 space, ch. 1. Rep. from * across, ending with (5 sc, ch. 3, 5 sc) in final ch-7 space, 1 tr in top of ch-4 turning ch. You should have 9 arched rows total. Cut YARN B and pull the end through the loop.

Repeat lace edging rows on the other short side of scarf. You can easily add more rows by adding more repeats of row 1 and ending with row 7.

Weave in all your ends. Wash and lay out scarf to block it. I pinned out the scallop shapes on the long edges and the lace points on the short edges.
